Even with the UK and U.S. collectively evacuating more than 100,000 people, there are still millions of Afghans displaced by the violence who are seeking safe passage out of the country.

Send Relief, a cooperative ministry between the International Mission Board and North American Mission Board, is working strategically with trusted ministry partners to help Afghan refugee families as they arrive in North America and other resettlement situations around the world.

You can help! There is extraordinary power in intentional prayer. Here are 10 meaningful ways to pray for Afghan refugees in crisis:

PRAY FOR:

1. The people of Afghanistan who are watching the destruction of their beloved homeland, that they would have the opportunity to receive the hope of the gospel and be hospitably welcomed into their new or temporary home countries.
2. The Afghan families who have been separated from their loved ones in their efforts to escape the Taliban, that they would be reunited in the near future.
3. The people who were impacted or bore witness to the horrors of the Taliban takeover to find psychological, emotional and spiritual healing from this trauma.
4. God to intervene on behalf of those who cannot be relocated.
5. All the communities, countries and churches receiving the massive number of refugees in the coming weeks to find resources, stamina and encouragement as they help these devastated people recover.
6. The women and girls being violently persecuted and forced into marriages with members of the Taliban to be rescued.
7. Government leaders, relief workers and humanitarian aid representatives to be filled with wisdom and compassion as they navigate the coming months.
8. Afghan believers whose lives are being threatened by the new regime. Ask God to give them courage, strength and protection.
9. Afghans at risk because of their service alongside the U.S. government and its allies, that they would be safely evacuated.
10. The millions of Afghans who have never heard the gospel to have an opportunity to hear about the hope of Jesus.
